

Measuring Temperature: Celsius

Temperature tells us how hot or cold something is. Temperature is measured in degrees Celsius in many parts of our world.

Celsius scale

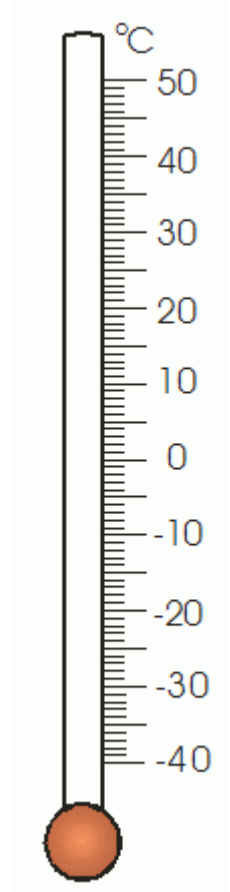
The Celsius scale gets its name from the Swedish astronomer Anders Celsius (1701 – 1744). He developed the scale two years before his death, but he used 0 for the boiling point of water, and 100 for the freezing point of water. These two were reversed in 1745, and so the two defining points for the Celsius scale became:

Freezing point of water	0°C
Boiling point of water	100°C

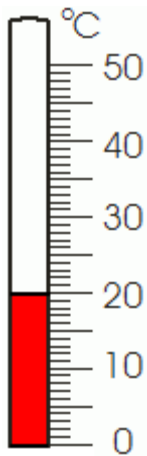

1. Mark these on the left side of the thermometer on the right.

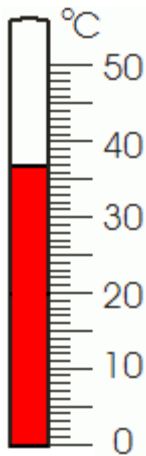
Normal body temperature	37°C

Below freezing (icy and snowy)	-40...0°C (negative)



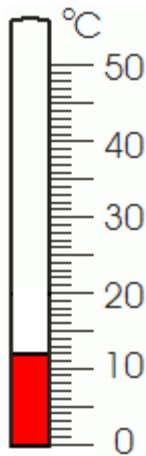

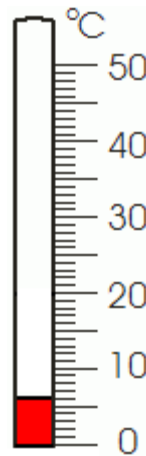

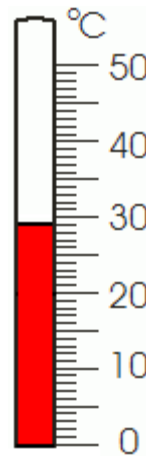
