

Half and Quarter Hours

The clock face is divided into four equal parts.
Each part is one-fourth.

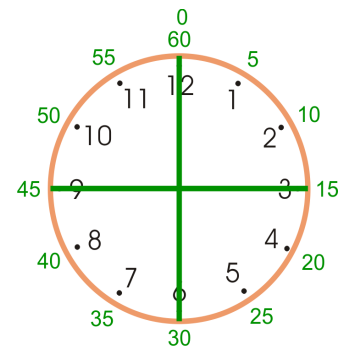
We can see that one-fourth of 60 minutes is 15 minutes.

The word “quarter” means one-fourth.

When we say, “A quarter past 6”, we mean one-fourth of an hour past 6 o'clock, or 15 minutes past 6.

When we say, “A quarter till 6”, we mean one-fourth of an hour till 6 o'clock, or 15 minutes till 6.

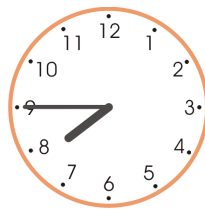
When we say, “Half-past 6”, we mean a half-hour past 6 o'clock, or 30 minutes past 6.



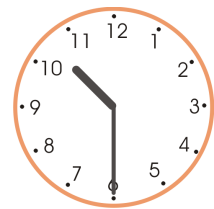
1 hour = 60 minutes.
 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour = 30 minutes.
 $\frac{1}{4}$ hour = 15 minutes.

15 till 8, OR a quarter till 8

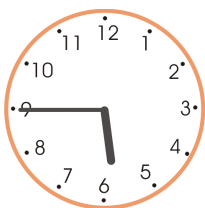
